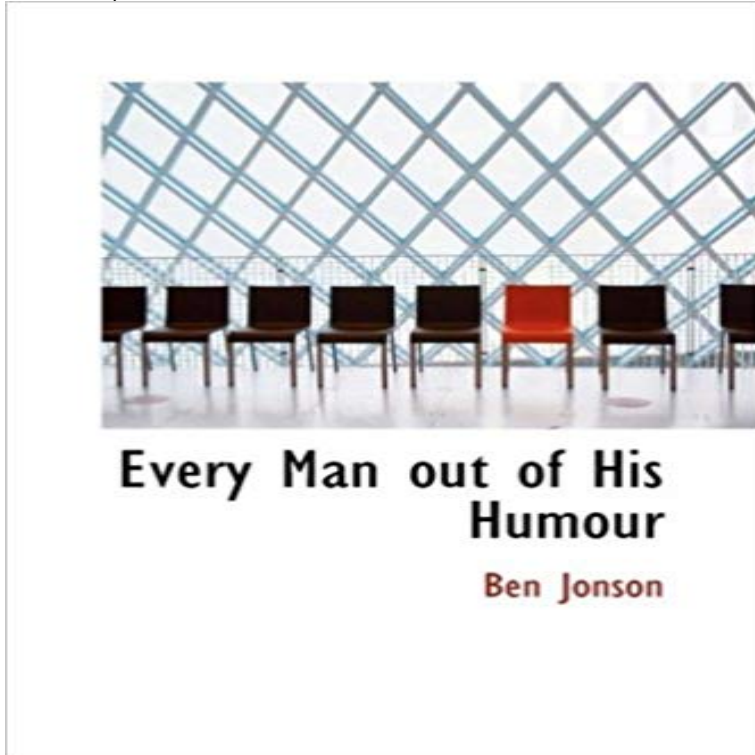


Every Man out of His Humour
