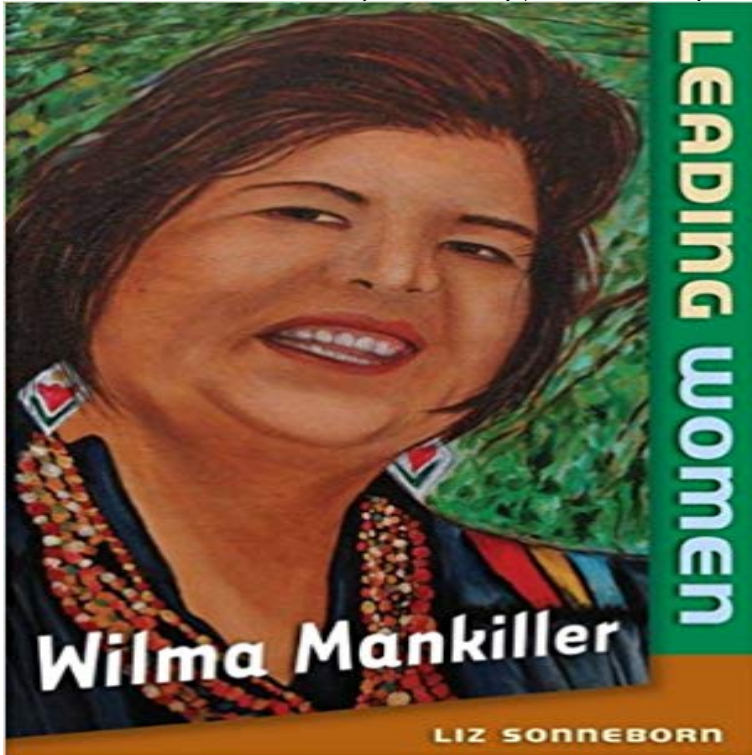


Wilma Mankiller (Leading Women)
