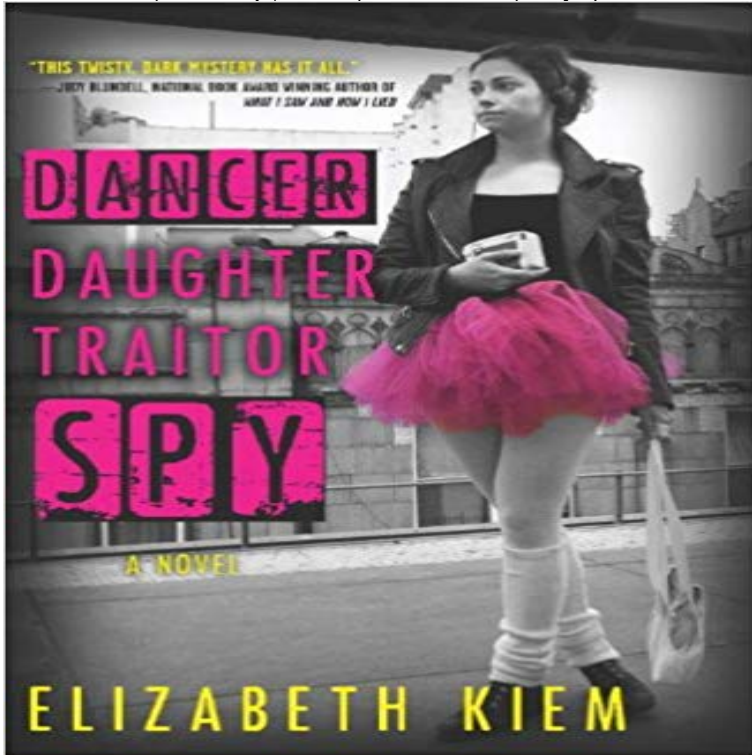


Dancer, Daughter, Traitor, Spy
