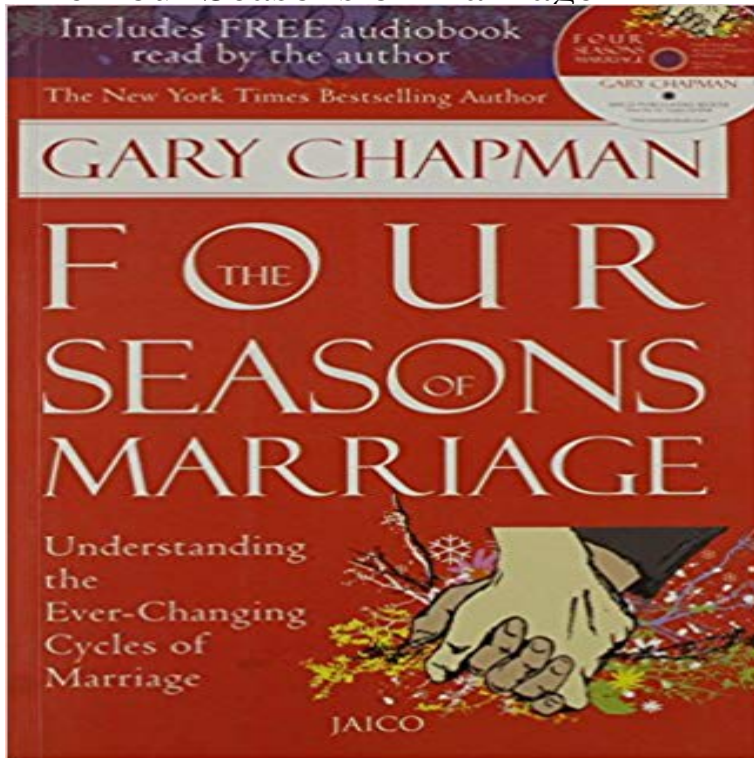


# The Four Seasons of Marriage
